# **Baptism: Meaning**

Baptism is an outward sign of...

- (1) Our *purification* from sin
- (2) Our identification with Christ

Acts 2:38: "Repent and let each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins..."

- Mark 16:15-16
- Acts 22:16
- Romans 6:4
- Colossians 2:12
- Galatians 3:27
- 1 Peter 3:21

## **Saving Effects**

- 1. Baptism is closely associated with the effects of saving faith
  - Forgiveness, cleansing, union with Christ, salvation

## Saving Effects

- 2. Part of the "conversion event"
  - Repentance/faith, reception of the Spirit, water baptism
  - "Baptism" is used as a synonym for salvation
- The concept of an "unbaptized believer" is foreign to the NT

## **Baptism and Salvation**

- Relationship of Faith and Baptism
  - Baptism is the outward confession of faith; the completion of faith

#### Acts 22:16

calling on God is inherent in the rite of water baptism

#### 1 Peter 3:21

 baptism is an "appeal" or pledge to God (this is what saves, not the water)

Inward faith always calls on God
-- Romans 10:9-10

# Baptism is the God-ordained, symbolic expression of calling on God

Q: Is water baptism necessary for salvation?

A: NO

## **Baptism and Salvation**

- Relationship of Faith and Baptism
  - Baptism is the outward confession of faith; the completion of faith
  - Baptism itself contributes nothing to the saving nature of faith

### A. Baptism itself is not efficacious

- Not the instrumental cause of our justification (ex opere operato)
- Baptism is always seen in obvious connection to conscious faith

# B. Baptism is the symbol not the essence of saving faith

 Faith alone is the instrumental cause (means) of our justification

### **Conclusion:**

- Baptism is not necessary for salvation and forgiveness
- Baptism is necessary as the Godordained sign of calling on Him
