The Accomplishment of the Cross

What did Jesus achieve by His death?

- > The salvation of sinners!
 - in His substitutionary death, Jesus suffered the penalty for our sins, and thereby rescued us from eternal death and judgment
 - the Bible communicates this truth using a variety of images

Images of the Atonement

1. Language of the Temple (sacrificial)

 key word: "propitiation"; emphasis – the wrath of God being turned away by a sacrifice

2. Language of the Market Place (economic)

 key word: "redemption"; emphasis – the great price paid to deliver the helpless sinner

3. Language of the Law-court (judicial)

 key word: "justification"; emphasis – the just demands of the law being satisfied on our behalf

Images of the Atonement

4. Language of the Home (relational)

- key word: "reconciliation"
- Definition:
 - > restore to a right (friendly) relationship after a break has occurred;
 - change from enmity to friendship

Man's greatest need is to be reconciled to God!

Reconciliation

The Need

- 1. What is the relationship between God and man?
 - "enemies" hostility and alienation
 - the emphasis is on God's disposition toward us (we are His enemies!)
- 2. What is the source of this enmity?
 - our sin devastated our relationship with God
 - Sin has offended God and kindled His wrath against us

Reconciliation

The Accomplishment

- 1. Who is the initiator?
 - Not the sinner
 - God the Father even though offended and full of wrath, He acts out of His love to accomplish our reconciliation
- 2. How did He accomplish this?
 - The death of Christ makes "peace"
 - 2 Cor. 5:21 God imputed our sin to Jesus and His righteousness to us

Reconciliation

The Result

- > "we have peace with God" Rom. 5:1
- > our eternal salvation is certain and secure!
