Lessons from the Fire

1. God's Might and Power displayed in nature:

- Every day in creation
- Natural disasters or acts of God

2. God's Sovereignty over and Providence in nature

- Lamentations 3:37-38
- No one speaks to cause something to come to pass unless the Lord has commanded in his sovereign decree that he or she should do so.
- Good and ill events are commanded by God to come to pass.

God causes "ill" or "evil"? What does that mean?

- Word "ill" does not refer to moral evil
- God never causes anyone to sin
- "Ill" refers to catastrophes or tragedies

Three key concepts within the overarching doctrine of providence:

- 1. Preservation- "God keeps all created things existing and maintaining the properties with which he created them."
- 2. Concurrence- "God cooperates with created things in every action, directing their distinctive properties to cause them to act as they do."


Three key concepts within the overarching doctrine of providence:

 Society, innately, is theologically correct regarding the worth and value of every human life.

- I Corinthians 1:1-10
- Jesus died for the church, that is the church universal
- God's calling is for us to be vitally connected to a local church

6. God sometimes scatters His church

- Not only does Jesus gather the church together but he also scatters the church.
- Acts 8:1, "And on that day a great persecution began against the church in Jerusalem, and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria..."

7. Strip us of a love for this world.

 Our eternal reward is so much greater than any earthly home and so let us hold loosely to comfortable living and let us fix our eyes on the heavenly prize.
