BIBLICAL VIEW OF CREATION

GENESIS 1:3-2:3: OBSERVATIONS

1. Geo-centric account

- · From man's perspective/observation
- Not concerned with galaxies, solar systems, other planets; but man, animals, fish/birds, sun/moon/stars, land/sea, sky, day/night
- Man is the pinnacle of creation—setting the stage for the unfolding of God's redemptive history with man

2. Simplicity of the account

- Eight creative acts in six days (days three and six each with two creative acts)
- Emphasis on the divine command—everything exists because of His will and by His power
- The process is not described (except?)

3. Definite pattern in the account

Deliberate symmetry—correspondence of days of creation

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GENESIS 1:3-2:3: OBSERVATIONS

Pattern

Announcement: "And God said"

Command: "let there be...let it be gathered...let it

bring forth

Report: "And it was so" (7x)

Execution: "And God made/created" (7x)

Evaluation: "And God saw that it was good" (7x)

Additional Word: "God called...God blessed" (7x)

Temporal Framework: "And there was evening and morning, the ...day" (6x; 7 days)
