#### Why the need for Scripture?

> To reveal God and His will for man

Can knowledge about God be found anywhere else?

Yes; God has revealed Himself to all men through creation and man's conscience

Why isn't this revelation sufficient?

It cannot bring men into a relationship with God; it lacks redemptive content

# **Summary**

## **Primary Point:**

- General revelation in itself does not produce a saving relationship with God
- It does leave all men everywhere without excuse for their ignorance and idolatry because they willfully refuse to acknowledge God

## Summary

## **Secondary Point:**

- Men do not respond to this revelation by honoring God and seeking to know Him, but willfully suppress this knowledge in rebellion against God
  - The meaning of Romans 1:18-32; (see also 1 Cor. 1:21; 2:14; John 3:19-20)
  - The sinfulness of natural man its effect on the mind and heart
  - Scriptural evidence that disproves the above point

# **Special Revelation**

- Definition: God's particular communications and manifestations of Himself to specific persons at specific times
- Purpose: to make Himself known to sinners that we might have relationship with Him
  - Relational, not merely informational

# **Special Revelation**

#### 1. Specific

- Not only in content, but to a very limited number of people at specific times
- Applicable in principle to everyone; binding force on all succeeding generations – God does not change

#### 2. How? - modes of revelation

- Acts of history (eg. Exodus, crucifixion)
- Divine speech
- The incarnation of His Son

# **Special Revelation**

### 3. Nature (Hebrews 1:1-2)

#### A. Verbal in form

- Real, objective, rational information
- No historical event can reveal God unless God discloses its meaning
- Allows for a written record of revelation

#### **B.** Cumulative

- Gradual process that "builds" to Christ
- Completed in Christ
- Necessitates a written record
