BIBLICAL VIEW OF CREATION

INTERPRETING GENESIS 2-3

Type of Literature

Historical Narrative: the characters are historical figures and the events actually occurred

OR

Paradigmatic: a paradigm or allegory written for a theological purpose—not historical

Evaluation

1. Textual Indicators

- · The form is simple, historical narrative
- Only element that may suggest an allegory is the "serpent" (he speaks; called "crafty")

2. Biblical Authors' Interpretation

- A. Adam & Eve are historical figures
 - Genealogies: Genesis 4:1-2; 5:1-5; Luke 3:23-38
 - Parallels between Adam & Jesus: Romans 5:15,17,19; 1 Cor. 15:21-22
- B. The events are understood as historical
 - Matthew 19:3-6
 - Romans 5:12
 - 1 Corinthians 11:8-9
 - 2 Corinthians 11:3
 - 1 Timothy 2:13-14
