Conclusions

1. Yahweh created the universe

- The heavens and earth and all their hosts exist by His will, power, wisdom and for His pleasure
- · Emphasis on His command

2. Polemic—unlike other "gods"

- Nature of God: self-existent, separate from the creation, sovereign over all
- Nature of creation: inanimate material under the control of God
- Nature of man: pinnacle of creation, made in the image of God

3. Genesis 2:4ff is historical narrative

- the characters are historical (i.e. Adam & Eve)
- the events are historical—God created Adam from the dust and created Eve from Adam

BIBLICAL VIEW OF CREATION

Legitimate Differences

- 1. Interpretation of the highly stylized form of Genesis 1:3-2:3
 - A. Historical narrative—seven, 24 hour, chronological days

OR

- B. Purposeful elevated prose—use of seven days is a literary device for theological purposes
- 2. Age of the Universe-related to number one
- 3. Chronology of Events (sequence)
 - Relationship between chapters one and two

Unacceptable Positions

- 1. Gap (Restitution) Theory
- 2. Day-Age Theory
- 3. Viewing chapter Genesis 2 as an allegory
- 4. Explaining the origin of man through *theistic* evolution
