## **Self-Claims**

- The authors, both of the Old and New Testaments, claim clearly and consistently that their words are the words of God
- Jesus claimed that both His own words and those of the OT Scriptures were the words of God

  - A. Authors' Credibility
  - B. Jesus' Credibility
  - C. Credibility of their Writings
    - there is no sufficient evidence to undermine the claims of these men

## 2. Characteristics of Divine Authorship

- A. Unity of the Record
  - Although subjective, it is yet remarkable in comparison with other literature
  - 40 authors from a variety of backgrounds written over 1500 years
  - Subject matter nature of God, origin and nature of man, purpose of life, morality, ethics, afterlife
  - One central story; unfolding of a plan

### **Substantiation**

- 2. Characteristics of Divine Authorship
  - **B. Fulfilled Prophesy** 
    - Prewritten history unique characteristic of God (Isaiah 46:8-10; Duet. 18:21-22)
    - Not vague, generic promises; specific, concrete predictions (often unexpected)
      - Isaiah 44:28-45:6 calls Cyrus by name; fulfilled 150 years later
      - Life of Jesus place of His birth and the manner of His death
