The Kingdom Lost (Genesis 3:1-24)

The Kingdom of God

God's people in God's place under God's rule and blessing

- 1. The Kingdom Modeled (Gen. 1-2)
 - man and woman in Eden ruling for God under His word and enjoying His provision and presence

The Kingdom of God

God's people in God's place under God's rule and blessing

- 2. The Kingdom Lost (Gen. 3-11)
 - the entrance of sin and death into the world through man's rebellion
 - banishment from God's place of blessing

The Kingdom Lost

The Consequences of Sin:

- 1. God and man
 - man hides from God does not seek God; he is afraid of God
 - man is corrupted by his knowledge; God's presence brings exposure
 - man is driven out of God's special place of blessing and sentenced to death

The Kingdom Lost

The Consequences of Sin:

- 2. Woman and man
 - the sentence on the woman involves a disruption of her appointed roles
 - the marriage relationship is negatively affected

The Kingdom Lost

The Consequences of Sin:

- 3. Man and the land
 - this close relationship, which marked God's blessing, is now disrupted
 - this disruption ensures that man will not enjoy "rest" from his labors

The Kingdom Lost

The Consequences of Sin:

- God's temporal judgments are means of calling man back to Himself
- These consequences are not isolated to Adam and Eve, but are imputed to the entire human race

The Kingdom Lost

Glimmers of Hope:

- 1. The description of v24 anticipates the coming sanctuary of Sinai
- 2. God's provision for man in his yet fallen condition
- 3. Adam's expression of faith in naming his wife "Eve"

The Kingdom Lost

Glimmers of Hope:

- 4. The promise of victory by the "<u>seed</u>" of the woman
 - refers to an ongoing battle with evil
 - ultimately, the individual "seed" ("he") will defeat the serpent (Satan)
