- Chapter 4: specific duties of each family of the Levites and census of men 30-50 yrs. old
- Chapter 8: consecration ceremony of the Levites for their unique role (occurred earlier)

The Levites

Introduction/Review

- > Unique Function
 - they were not priests but served the priests
 - they performed the "guard service" for the tabernacle and the holy objects
 - they alone were responsible for dismantling, transporting and erecting the tabernacle

The Levites

Numbers 8:5-26

- 1. Consecration Ceremony
 - The Levites are presented as a substitutionary (living) sacrifice
 - The Levites are presented as a "wave offering" they belong to the priests

The Levites

Numbers 8:5-26

- 2. Explanation
 - The Levites belong exclusively to the Lord and are given to the priests to assist with the tabernacle
 - The Lord takes the Levites instead of every firstborn male of the sons of Israel

The Levites

Excursus: Theology of the first-born

- **1.** *Passover* in the final plague God delivered the first-born of Israel through the blood of a lamb
 - principle #1 deliverance from judgment and slavery through a substitutionary death
- principle #2 deliverance by God (redemption) results in belonging uniquely to the Lord

The Levites

Excursus: Theology of the first-born

- 2. Consecration every first-born son had to be consecrated to God
 - The first-born were consecrated to God by means of a redemption price
 - This consecration was only ceremonial there was no outward expression of it

Numbers 3:40-51 - The Levites instead of the first-born

The Levites

Theological Significance

- > The Levites demonstrate consecration to the Lord that is the result of redemption
 - · They were exclusively devoted to the tabernacle
 - They had no inheritance in the land
 - They were supported by the tithe of the people

The Levites

New Covenant Application

- > The Levites picture the consecration of every redeemed disciple of Jesus
 - As redeemed, we belong uniquely and exclusively to Christ (1 Cor. 6:19-20)
 - Every disciple of Jesus is a "full-time" servant
 - Every aspect of life is to be an act of service/worship no distinction between "sacred" and "secular"

The Levites
