1. Fundamental Affirmation

> "Yahweh our God; Yahweh alone!"

2. Fundamental Obligation

➤ "Love Yahweh your God"

3. Fundamental Application

> "These words shall be on your heart"

"These words shall be on your heart"

- (1) Internalizing of God's words
- (2) Centrality of God's words

The Shema (pt 2)

Centrality of God's Word

- 1. The necessity of teaching God's words in the home
- The home is an essential context for instruction in God's words
- It is the responsibility of parents to diligently teach God's words to their children

The Shema (pt 2)

Centrality of God's Word

- 2. The necessity of constant reflection on God's words in the course of everyday life
 - God's words are to be the topic of conversation throughout the day
 - Assumes that parents are intimately acquainted with God's words

The Shema (pt 2)

Centrality of God's Word

- 3. The necessity of application of God's words to every sphere of life
- hands/forehead individual
- doorposts the family
- gates the community

The Shema (pt 2)

Illustration (6:20-25)

Q: "What is the significance of the Law?"

A: Two-fold

- The story of their redemption by God
- The beneficial value of the Law

Principle:

Ground all your teaching of God's word in the gospel of Jesus Christ
