The Kingdom of God

Kingdom Promised

- > Covenant with Abraham
- 1. Blessing
 - Abraham and his descendants
 - "all the families of the earth"

The Kingdom of God

Kingdom Promised

- > Covenant with Abraham
- 2. Land
 - the land of Canaan
 - an everlasting possession

The Kingdom of God

Kingdom Promised

- > Covenant with Abraham
- 3. Seed
 - singular (one descendant)
 - multitude "a great nation"

The Kingdom of God

Toward Fulfillment...

- > Deliverance from Egypt
 - based on the Abrahamic covenant
 - God redeemed Israel for Himself

Marked Israel's birth as a nation

The Kingdom of God


Toward Fulfillment...

- > Covenant at Sinai
 - essential to Israel's existence and purpose as a nation
 - purpose: "a kingdom of priests and a holy nation"

Theological Issues:

- 1. Does this covenant teach meriting God's blessing/salvation through law-keeping?
- 2. What effect does the coming of Jesus have upon this covenant?
- 3. As Christians, what is our ongoing relationship to this covenant?



Covenant at Sinai

God's Epiphany

- > A terrifying display of God's awful majesty and holiness!
- Communicates the nature of the God with whom they make a covenant
- emphasizes God's separateness not readily approachable

Covenant at Sinai

God's Epiphany

- > What is the intended effect?
- To produce a "fear" of God that leads to holiness of life
- To perceive the need for a mediator

Points us forward to Jesus, our mediator
