

Waters of Meribah

Setting: Back at Kadesh

- 38 years later the 40th year since leaving Egypt
- Much of the first generation has died the movement toward Canaan is beginning again

Waters of Meribah

Numbers 20:2-13

- > Two surprising features!
- **1.** The Lord's non-judgment on His people for their grumbling, and instead, His gracious provision
- 2. The Lord's strict judgment on His servants Moses and Aaron for a "minor" offense

Waters of Meribah

1. The Lord's Provision

- > This event was a test/trial to...
- make them deeply conscious of their complete dependence on God and remove self-reliance
- teach them that following God's word is the source of life and satisfaction

Waters of Meribah

2. The Rebellion of Moses (& Aaron)

- > His acts of disobedience
 - He spoke harshly to the people apart from God's command
 - He struck the rock twice instead of speaking to the rock

Waters of Meribah

2. The Rebellion of Moses (& Aaron)

- > The nature of his "unbelief"
- He did not believe God's gracious response was appropriate – he sought to take vengeance himself
- He pointed too much to himself as the source of the water and thus detracted from God and the lesson God purposed to teach

Waters of Meribah

Lessons

- 1. Those in spiritual leadership incur a stricter judgment
- **2.** The consequences of sin in this age may be severe and lifelong
- 3. Self-promotion that detracts from God's glory is a great offense to God
- **4.** Words spoken rashly in anger may cause irreparable harm

Lessons

- **5.** The anger of man does not achieve the righteousness of God
- **6.** Begrudging God's mercy to sinners is a form of unbelief
- 7. Vigilance over the heart is needed until the very end
