Theology of the Law

Summary (pts. 1 - 4)

> The Law is an expression of God's ongoing love for His people, and is not contrary to His promise to Abraham

Purpose of the Law

- 1. To typologically define God's people as a holy nation
- > Exodus 19:5-6
 - A nation uniquely set apart for God as His representative
 - · A nation in which God uniquely dwells

Purpose of the Law

- 1. To typologically define God's people as a holy nation
- > temporary nature
 - The nation of Israel in this form is not the final form of God's kingdom
 - This covenant is also then temporary and limited in its function

Purpose of the Law

- 1. To typologically define God's people as a holy nation
- > typological nature
 - "type" a shadowy picture of a greater reality/fulfillment
 - The Mosaic Law foreshadows Christ His work and righteousness

Purpose of the Law

"And beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself from all the Scriptures." (Luke 24:27)

"...all things written about Me in the Law of Moses and the prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." (Luke 24:44)

"You search the Scriptures, because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is these that bear witness of Me...

For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me; for He wrote of Me." (John 5:39, 46)

Purpose of the Law

The Law's Foreshadowing of Christ

- The tabernacle prefigures God's presence through Christ
- The sacrifices prefigure the final sacrifice of Christ
- The priests prefigure the relationship of Christ to His people

Purpose of the Law

The Law's Foreshadowing of Christ

- The Law and its order prefigure the righteousness of Christ
- The punishments and penalties prefigure the destruction of sin and guilt through Christ
- The land of Palestine prefigures Christ renewal and dominion over the earth
