# **Hope of Salvation:**

- □ Not merely when we die our souls go to heaven, but...
- The resurrection of the body and inheriting the eternal kingdom

# Nature of Our Resurrection

#### **Essentials:**

- 1. An essential continuity with our current bodies
  - the body that dies is essentially the body that is raised (you will be you)
  - it will be a physical body

# Nature of Our Resurrection

## **Essentials:**

- 2. A glorious transformation of our current bodies
  - a radical newness to our bodies
  - not a change from physical to nonphysical, or human to non-human

# Nature of Our Resurrection "Transformation"

1 Corinthians 15:35-58

# Nature of Our Resurrection

#### Settina:

- there were some in Corinth who denied the idea of bodily resurrection
- influenced by Greek dualism the body is inferior and corrupt
- ☐ the concept of corpses coming to life was absurd ("how"; "what body")

# Nature of Our Resurrection

#### Paul's Response:

- 1. Two Analogies: "seeds" and "bodies"
  - seeds: a body sown one way is raised another (death brings forth new life)
  - bodies: there are a variety of bodies, each adapted to their peculiar existence

# Nature of Our Resurrection

#### Paul's Response:

- 2. Application to the Resurrection
  - Transformation of our bodies, adapted for existence in the eternal kingdom
    - perishable to imperishable
    - dishonor to glory
    - weakness to power
    - natural to spiritual

# Nature of Our Resurrection

- natural to spiritual

# Nature of Our Resurrection

# natural to spiritual

- both are bodies (i.e. physical)
- "natural" = a fallen, perishable body that belongs to life in the present age
- "spiritual" = a body that belongs to the life of the Spirit in the age to come
- our natural body relates to Adam; our spiritual body relates to the risen Jesus

# Nature of Our Resurrection

### Paul's Response:

- 3. Necessity of Transformation
  - Our present, perishable, weak bodies cannot inherit the eternal kingdom ("flesh and blood" = perishable bodies)
  - Both the dead and the living will be changed at Christ's return

# Nature of Our Resurrection

#### Conclusion:

- This victory over death is given through our Lord Jesus
- death is the judgment for sin which is made known by the Law
- Christ paid the penalty for our sin and therefore conquered death

His resurrection guarantees our resurrection and inheritance of the eternal kingdom
