The Atonement: Necessity

Premise:

God cannot forgive sin without adequate atonement, namely, the death of Christ

Question:

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Why can't God chose, according to His great mercy, simply to forgive repentant sinners?

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The Atonement: Necessity

Answer: The Holiness of God

1. God's wrath/anger is the inevitable or necessary response of His holiness to sin

2. The execution of God's wrath against sin is His retributive or punitive justice

The Atonement: Necessity

"Shall not the Judge of all the earth deal justly?" (Genesis 18:25)

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The Atonement: Necessity

Psalm 7:11 – God is a righteous judge, and a God who has indignation every day.

Psalm 9:7-8 - ... He has established His throne for judgment, And He will judge the world in righteousness; He will execute judgment for the peoples with equity.

Psalm 94:2 - Rise up, O Judge of the earth, render recompense to the proud.

Psalm 96:10 - ... He is coming to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples in faithfulness.

Psalm 97:2 - ... Righteousness and justice are the foundation of His throne.

The Atonement: Necessity

Duet. 32:4 - ... For all His ways are just; a God of faithfulness and without injustice, righteous and upright is He.

Romans 3:5-6 - ... The God who inflicts wrath is not unrighteous is He? May it never be! For otherwise how will God judge the world?

Acts 17:31 - He has fixed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness through a man whom He has appointed...

Matt. 25:31 - But when the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, then He will sit on His glorious throne.

Rev. 20:11 - And I saw a great white throne and Him who sat upon it, from whose presence earth and heaven fled away ...

The Atonement: Necessity

2 Thessalonians 1:6-9:

- For it is only just for God to repay with affliction those who afflict you, ...when the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven
- with His mighty angels in flaming fire, dealing out <u>retribution</u> to those who do not know God and to those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. And these will <u>pay the penalty</u> of eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power,

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The Atonement: Necessity

Justice of God

- God is absolutely and necessarily just
 - His justice is not relative, but perfect
 - He cannot but be just

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The Atonement: Necessity

Justice of God

1. He will never leave the guilty unpunished

Exodus 34:7

• in accordance with His justice, He must punish all sin

• in the ultimate sense, "the guilty" is everyone

How is that God "forgives" the guilty and yet never leaves the guilty unpunished?

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The Atonement: Necessity

Justice of God

- 2. He will render to every person what is due
- ➢ Romans 2:5-6
- His judgment is individual and impartial
- His punishment is never too light or too severe
- His just punishment has an infinite quality seen in its eternal duration

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The Atonement: Necessity

Question:

Knowing that God is necessarily just and cannot but punish sin, what hope is there for any to be saved?

Answer:

Only if God provided a just and sufficient means for removing His wrath and making sinners righteous
