The Atonement: Nature

Penal Substitution

God, in His love, sent His Son Jesus, who, as our representative substitute, bore the just penalty/judgment (i.e. God's wrath) for our sin by His death on the cross...whereby God's wrath is removed and sinners are reconciled to God through faith in Jesus

The Atonement: Nature

Isaiah 53:5 – "He was pierced through for our transgression, He was crushed for our iniquities; the chastening for our well being fell upon Him..."

Gal. 3:13 – "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us – for it is written, CURSED IS EVERYONE WHO HANGS ON A TREE."

Col. 2:14 – "having canceled out the certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us and which was hostile to us; and He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross."

1 Pet. 3:18 – "For Christ also died for sins once for all, the just for the unjust, in order that He might bring us to God..."

Heb. 2:17 – "Therefore, He had to made like His brethren in all things, that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people."

1 John 2:1-2 – "...if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and He Himself is the propitiation for our sins..."

The Atonement: Nature

1. Who is the author of reconciliation?

- God, the Father
 - God initiated and provided completely for our reconciliation
 - Though offended, God in His love provides the means for removing His offense

The Atonement: Nature

2. Who is the agent of reconciliation?

- > Christ Jesus (God, the Son)
 - · God reconciled us "in" and "through" Christ
 - Jesus is not an independent mediator or a helpless victim

The Atonement: Nature

3. What is the essence of reconciliation?

- * "not counting their trespasses against them"
 - it is not chiefly the overcoming of man's attitude, but the removal of man's guilt
 - it is the removal of sin's penalty, which is the just judgment/wrath of God

The Atonement: Nature

4. What is the basis of reconciliation?

- > the penal substitutionary death of Jesus
 - "He made Him sin" God counted our sins against Christ as our substitute (bore sin's penalty)
- We are counted righteous in Christ and are thereby reconciled to God

Conclusion

- > "Be reconciled to God"
 - By faith received the reconciliation that God has accomplished through Christ
