➤ God is forming a people to live in His place enjoying His presence under His rule and blessing

# **God's Kingdom Purpose**

- 1. The Kingdom Patterned
  - Man enjoyed God's limitless blessing and His presence in the sanctuary of Eden
  - Man, as God's image bearer, was to rule and subdue and fill the earth

# **God's Kingdom Purpose**

- 2. The Kingdom Perished
  - Man rebelled against God and was corrupted; he was banished from Eden and subjected to death
  - Began a downward cycle of sin, death and judgment...yet with glimmers of hope

### **God's Kingdom Purpose**

- 3. The Kingdom Promised
  - An irrevocable promise of kingdom restoration to Abraham and his "seed"
  - This is the foundational promise of the Bible!

Jesus is the son/seed of Abraham who fulfills this promise

#### Introduction

#### **God's Kingdom Purpose**

- 4. The Kingdom Pictured (in Part)
  - Through the Mosaic Covenant, God established Israel as a holy nation in the land of Canaan
  - God promised David that his "son/seed" would reign on the throne forever (2 Sam. 7:12-16)

Jesus is the Son of David, the Christ, who will reign forever

# **God's Kingdom Purpose**

- 5. The Kingdom Prophesied
  - God promises through the prophets a glorious kingdom restoration following exile
  - This restoration will be brought by the Davidic king, God's "Messiah"

# **Gospel of Matthew**

- 1. Theme: "fulfillment"
  - "fulfill" key word in Matthew
  - there are 54 direct Old Testament citations and over 260 allusions or verbal parallels in Matthew

# Introduction

#### **Gospel of Matthew**

- 2. Purposes: Matthew demonstrates...
  - that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of David, the Son of God, to whom the Scriptures pointed
  - that the promised kingdom has been inaugurated by the life, death and exaltation of Jesus
  - that this messianic reign is continuing as believers submit to Jesus and make disciples of all nations
  - that this messianic kingdom will be consummated when Jesus the Messiah personally returns
