Structure:

- (1) First Three Petitions: God-focused
 - "Your name", "Your kingdom", "Your will"
- (2) Final Three Petitions: Our Needs
 - "give us", "forgive us", "lead us"

"Pray Like This..."

Proper Petitions to God (con't.)

- (1) "Give us this day our daily bread"
 - a request for God to provide "daily" for our basic physical necessities
 - an expression of dependence on God as the giver of every good thing

"Pray Like This..."

Proper Petitions to God (con't.)

- (2) "Forgive us our debts"
 - an ongoing request for forgiveness as part of our relationship to our Father in heaven
 - a request to be forgiven in the manner that we forgive those who sin against us

"Pray Like This..."

Proper Petitions to God (con't.)

- (3) "Lead us/Deliver Us"
 - a request that God would keep us from and deliver us out of Satan's temptations
 - an expression of our need for God's help to keep us from stumbling

"Pray Like This..."

Comment on Forgiveness

- 1. Why this emphasis?
 - > it is the one petition that most directly undercuts religious hypocrisy and manifests true kingdom righteousness

Comment on Forgiveness

- 2. What does it mean?
 - our forgiveness by God is conditioned on our forgiveness of others
- not a meriting of God's forgiveness but the display of one who has experienced God's forgiveness
