Three Elements

- 1. Perspective compassion for the "lost"
- 2. Purpose to extend the saving reign of God
- 3. Expectation hostility and opposition

"Do not think that I came to bring peace on the earth; I did not come to bring peace but a sword.

Nature of Discipleship

- 1. Effects of Following Jesus
 - not outward peace but division even within family relationships
 - lives so transformed in their direction and values that they clash with even the most intimate of relationships



Nature of Discipleship

Why this effect?

- 1. The entire world order is given over in rebellion to God
- 2. Jesus demands supreme allegiance to Himself even over family



Nature of Discipleship

- 2. Essence of Following Jesus
 - a call to supreme devotion to Jesus over every human relationship
 - a call to an ongoing death to self-interest, even unto physical death



Nature of Discipleship

Implications

- becoming a follower of Jesus is not a mere addition to your other allegiances
- following Jesus cannot be limited to a mere aspect of your life – He demands your whole life or nothing
