## The Greatest Commandment

> "depend the whole Law and the Prophets"

- nothing in Scripture can cohere or be truly obeyed unless these two are observed
- the entire biblical revelation demands "heart religion" marked by total allegiance to God


## The Greatest Commandment

1. "Love the Lord your God..."

- a whole-hearted love - we are to love God with our whole self (affections, will, mind)
- an exclusive love - no other competing loves or functional "gods" (i.e. "idolatry")
- an obedient love - the primary expression of this love is glad-hearted obedience to God


## The Greatest Commandment

2. "Love Your Neighbor..."

Q: why does Jesus include this command?

- love for others is the necessary and visible manifestation of love for God (1 John 4:20)
- loving your neighbor as yourself summarizes and fulfills the Law (Rom. 13:8-9)

## The Greatest Commandment

What is the resource for this love?
$>$ our love for and satisfaction in God

- all our longings and desires are satisfied forever in God
- self-giving loves increases our joy and fulfillment in God
