
Kingdom of God: God is forming a people to live in His place enjoying His presence under His rule and blessing

- Rebellion at Kadesh (Num. 13-14)
- Failure of Moses (Num. 20)
- Commissioning of Joshua (Num. 27)
- Renewal of the Covenant (Deuteronomy)



Introduction to Joshua

- A. The Message of Joshua
 - Primary: The Lord's faithfulness to accomplish His promise
 - Secondary: The blessing and necessity of covenant loyalty/obedience

Introduction to Joshua

- B. The Importance of the Land
 - The land of promise has a theological, symbolic significance that goes beyond the nation of Israel and the borders of Canaan

Introduction to Joshua

- B. The Importance of the Land
 - The promise of the land represented a return to Eden (in part)
 - 2. Israel's inheritance of Canaan was a preliminary stage to and symbolic of the ultimate fulfillment
 - 3. Jesus came to bring the final fulfillment of this promise of which Canaan was a type

Introduction to Joshua

- B. The Importance of the Land
- > Fulfillment in Jesus ("already & not yet")
 - Canaan is a type of the "salvation-rest" that is available to us presently in Jesus (Heb. 4:7-11)
 - Canaan is a type of the final kingdom that Jesus will establish (Heb. 11:16)
