Fall of Jericho



- 1. The Lord's peculiar procedure
 - the prominence of the ark of the covenant
 - the repetition of the number "seven" (14x)
 - the passivity of the people

Fall of Jericho



- 1. The Lord's peculiar procedure
 - > Lessons
 - the conquest is entirely the Lord's work
 - the response of God's people is faith and obedience (c.f. Heb. 11:30)

Fall of Jericho

- 2. The Lord's peculiar demand
 - > "herem" (Heb.)
 - someone or something that was absolutely and irrevocably "devoted" to the Lord so that it could not be redeemed
 - any person or thing so devoted was to be utterly destroyed (except precious metal)

Fall of Jericho

- 2. The Lord's peculiar demand
 - > Purposes of "herem"
 - (1) the execution of God's just judgment on unrepentant, idolatrous enemies

Fall of Jericho

- 2. The Lord's peculiar demand
 - > Purposes of "herem"
 - (2) the protection of God's people from the corruption of idolatry

Fall of Jericho

- 2. The Lord's peculiar demand
 - > Purposes of "herem"
 - (3) the eradication of all idolatry and detestable practices from the Lord's land

Fall of Jericho

- 3. The Lord's merciful exception
 - > Rahab the harlot
 - she is a paradigm of one who escapes the judgment of God through faith
 - God's mercy is available to anyone who comes in faith, even in the last hour
