- 3. The Awareness of Samson
 - he acknowledged his absolute dependence on Yahweh for life and victory
 - he recognized that he was the agent/servant of Yahweh's deliverance

Samson (pt. 3)

- 4. The Provision of Yahweh
 - He miraculously provided water from the rock to revive His servant
 - "Caller's Spring" symbolizes that no matter how bleak things seem, there is always hope for those who call on Yahweh

Samson (pt. 3)

Prefiguring Jesus...

- he is rejected as a deliverer and handed over to his enemies by His own people; it is through this rejection that he achieves deliverance for His people
- God delivers His people through the one champion whose victory accrues to all His people
