



<sup>42</sup> They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

<sup>43</sup> Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles. <sup>44</sup> And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; <sup>45</sup> and they *began* selling their property and possessions and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need. <sup>46</sup> Day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart, <sup>47</sup> praising God and having favor with all the people. ### Spirit-Created Community

Devoted to these things...

- 1. The Apostles' Teaching
  - content the life, ministry, teachings, death and resurrection of Jesus; both as instruction for believers and proclamation to unbelievers
  - the apostles were Jesus' authoritative spokesmen, accredited with signs and wonders

# Spirit-Created Community

Devoted to these things...

- 1. The Apostles' Teaching
  - today, we devote ourselves to the written deposit of the apostles' teaching the Scriptures

# Spirit-Created Community

#### Devoted to these things...

- 2. The Fellowship (koinonia)
  - refers to the profound relationship we share in Jesus produced by the Holy Spirit
  - the sharing of finances and material goods to meet the needs of others is the most common expression of "fellowship" in the Bible (cf. 2 Cor. 8:4; 9:13; Rom. 15:26; Phil. 1:5)

## Spirit-Created Community

Devoted to these things...

- 3. The Breaking of Bread
  - refers to the common meals shared by the disciples together
  - these meals were associated with teaching, prayer and praise (maybe a form of "the Lord's Supper" – 1 Cor. 11:17ff)

# Spirit-Created Community

Devoted to these things...

- 4. The Prayers
  - refers to corporate prayers both at the temple and from house to house
