

Herod v. God

1. Renewed Opposition



Herod Agrippa I

- grandson of Herod the Great; mother was Jewish (father was executed)
- appointed ruler ("king") over most of Palestine by emperors Caligula and Claudius
- ruled Judea from A.D. 41-44

Herod v. God

- 1. Renewed Opposition
 - the church will always face various forms of opposition and hostility
 - this opposition results in real suffering, hardship and even death of Christians

Herod v. God

- 2. Divine Frustration
 - God frustrated the desires of Herod by...
 - miraculously delivering Peter at the last hour
 - striking Herod dead in the midst of his pomp and vain-glory

Herod v. God

Principle:

The refusal to give God glory as God will result in God's judgment (cf. Rom. 1:21)

Herod v. God

- 3. Continued Growth
 - God appoints tragedy and triumph for the growth of the gospel
 - nothing ultimately will thwart Jesus' building of His church
