## Paul's Example of Shepherding

- 1. Paul's Life
  - · not arrogant, abusive or entitled
  - · genuine love and intense concern for people
  - · endured hardship and great personal costs

Therefore, I exhort the elders among you,...

<sup>2</sup> shepherd the flock of God among you, exercising oversight not under compulsion, but voluntarily, according to *the will of* God; and not for sordid gain, but with eagerness;

<sup>3</sup> nor yet as lording it over those allotted to your charge, but proving to be examples to the flock.

<sup>4</sup>And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory. (1 Peter 5:2-4)

## Paul's Example of Shepherding

- 2. Paul's Teaching
  - · he did not withhold any portion of the truth
  - · he taught publicly and personally
  - · the center of his proclamation was the gospel

## Paul's Example of Shepherding

- 3. Paul's Perspective
  - he did not count his life as the most valuable thing in this life
  - he considered faithfulness to Christ as more valuable than life
