## A Compelling Testimony

- 1. Paul's former manner of life
  - · he was devoted to Judaism as a strict Pharisee
  - as a strict Pharisee, he was the chief persecutor of followers of Jesus

## A Compelling Testimony

- 2. Paul's dramatic conversion
  - his conversion to faith in Jesus was entirely unexpected and otherwise inexplicable
  - his conversion was instantaneous, irresistible and life changing

- 3. Paul's faithfulness to the Jewish hope
  - the resurrection of Jesus is the fulfillment of the hope of the promise given by God to Israel
  - faith in the risen Christ Jesus is not a departure from Judaism but a fulfillment of it
