



What is the purpose of this account?

Displays the providence of God in accomplishing His purpose, namely the progress of the gospel

Providence – God's ongoing relationship to creation by which He sustains and directs all things according to His purpose

God's Peculiar Providence

- 1. Life and death are ultimately in God's hands
 - though He uses "natural" means, God is the ultimate cause
 - "I am immortal till my work is accomplished" – David Livingston

God's Peculiar Providence

- 2. Trust in God's providence dispels fear in danger
 - Paul knew that he "belonged" to God and was His servant
 - Paul believed God would do exactly what He promised

God's Peculiar Providence

2. Trust in God's providence dispels fear in danger

"The Lord will rescue me from every evil deed, and will bring me safely to His heavenly kingdom; to Him be the glory forever and ever. Amen."

(2 Timothy 4:18)

God's Peculiar Providence

3. Divine providence includes "natural" sufferings

- God does not exempt his people from natural disasters, diseases or difficulties
- God appoints and works these "sufferings" for the good of his people (Rom. 8:28)

God's Peculiar Providence

- 3. Divine providence includes "natural" sufferings
 - ➢ Why?
 - to provide unique opportunities to magnify the worth of God and the hope of the gospel
 - to increase our trust and hope in Christ's allsatisfying sufficiency (2 Cor. 1:8-10)
