


Scene One: Betrayal & Guidance

- God's Word to David
 - David desired God's guidance and gladly submitted to it
 - David had access to the Lord while Saul had only his own resources



Scene Two: *Betrayal & Providence*

- God's Unseen Hand
 - God used "natural circumstances" to deliver David from Saul
 - David attributed his escape not to fortunate circumstances but to the Lord (cf. Psalm 54)

¹ Save me, O God, by Your name,
And vindicate me by Your power.
² Hear my prayer, O God;
Give ear to the words of my mouth.
³ For strangers have risen against me
And violent men have sought my life;
They have not set God before them. (Selah)
⁴ Behold, God is my helper;
The Lord is the sustainer of my soul.
⁵ He will recompense the evil to my foes;
Destroy them in Your faithfulness.
⁶ Willingly I will sacrifice to You;
I will give thanks to Your name, O LORD, for it is good.
⁷ For He has delivered me from all trouble, and my eye
has looked with satisfaction upon my enemies.
(Psalm 54)

Scene Three: Covenant Loyalty ¹⁶ And Jonathan, Saul's son, arose and went to David at Horesh, and strengthened his hand in God. ¹⁷ Thus he said to him, "Do not be afraid, because the hand of Saul my father will not find you, and you will be king over Israel and I will be next to you; and Saul my father knows that also." ¹⁸ So the two of them made a covenant before the LORD; and David stayed at Horesh while Jonathan went to his house.

Scene Three: Covenant Loyalty

- Jonathan strengthened David
 - he strengthened David's hand "in God" not in himself
 - he reassured David of God's unfailing and unstoppable promises to him
