

Sufficiency of Scripture—some clarifications

- Separate from the topics of authority and inerrancy.
- It does not teach that Scripture is exhaustive in what it reveals to us.
- It does not teach that we are not to have human teachers, or that there are no other legitimate authorities in our lives.
- Fundamentally it represents the fact that God alone is the Lord who has ultimate authority and that Scripture has critical utility in our daily lives.

Biblical Basis for the Sufficiency of Scripture (1)

- **■** Psalm 19:7-11
 - The law of the LORD is perfect, reviving the soul; the testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple; the precepts of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes; the fear of the LORD is clean, enduring forever; the rules of the LORD are true, and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb. Moreover, by them is your servant warned; in keeping them there is great reward.

Biblical Basis for the Sufficiency of Scripture (2)

- 2 Timothy 3:14-17
 - But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned if and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work.

Biblical Basis for the Sufficiency of Scripture (3)


- 2 Peter 1:20-21
 - ...knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

Biblical Basis for the Sufficiency of Scripture (4)


- ► Hebrews 4:12-13
 - For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marow, and disceming the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

A Look at 2 Peter 1 and the Sufficiency of Scripture







