The Crisis

- 1. The enemies (v.1)
- 2. The accusation (v.2)

David's Three Responses in Crisis

- 1. His sense of identity was based in his relationship with God (vv.3-4)
- 2. His sense of physical security was based in his relationship with God (vv.5-7)
- Underlying his sense of identity and security was his knowledge of God's spiritual salvation (v.8)
