(Acts 2; Eph. 4; I Cor.12; Heb. 10)

Submission and Shepherding

> Hebrews 13:1-17

¹⁷ Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they keep watch over your souls as those who will give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with grief, for this would be unprofitable for you.

Submission and Shepherding

- ➤ Hebrews 13:17
 - Submitting to local, qualified spiritual leaders for our spiritual care is an essential aspect of meaningful membership
 - 2. The aim and desire of the elders is to watch over your soul with joy and not grief
