Romans 3:21-26

"The chief point... of the whole Bible" (Luther)

²¹ But now apart from the Law *the* righteousness of God has been manifested, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, ²² even *the* righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe; for there is no distinction;

²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,
²⁴ being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption

²⁴ being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus; ²⁵ when Cod displayed publicly as a propitiotion in His blood.

²⁵ whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith. *This was* to demonstrate His righteousness, because in the forbearance of God He passed over the sins previously committed;

²⁶ for the demonstration, *I say*, of His righteousness at the present time, so that He would be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

God's Righteousness Manifested

Context

- 1:16-17: the gospel reveals the saving activity of God (through judgment) in which He is vindicated
- 1:18-3:20: God's charge that all humanity is under sin so that He is justified in His condemnation

God's Righteousness Manifested

1. Apart From the Law

- *"but now"* a temporal contrast between the old era and the new era inaugurated in Christ
- "apart from the Law" God's righteousness has been made known apart from the Old Covenant and is received apart from Law-keeping

God's Righteousness Manifested

- 1. Apart From the Law
 - "witnessed by the Law and prophets" the Old Testament anticipates this final, great deliverance by God of His people through Messiah

God's Righteousness Manifested

- 2. Received by Faith Alone
 - God's righteousness is given (as a gift) through faith apart from any works
 - this faith has as its object Jesus Christ, crucified and risen
 - this righteousness is for all who believe

God's Righteousness Manifested

- 3. Available Only to Sinners
 - God's righteousness is available to all through faith because all alike are sinners
 - sin is essentially a rejection of the glory of God in exchange for that which is not God
