#### The Book of Romans

The Gospel of God

- <sup>21</sup>But now apart from the Law *the* righteousness of God has been manifested, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets,
- <sup>22</sup> even *the* righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe; for there is no distinction;
  - <sup>23</sup> for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,
- <sup>24</sup> being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus;
- <sup>25</sup>whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith. *This was* to demonstrate His righteousness, because in the forbearance of God He passed over the sins previously committed:
- <sup>26</sup> for the demonstration, *I say*, of His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

(Romans 3:21-26)

#### God's Righteousness Manifested (pt. 4)

- > Context
  - 1:16-17: the gospel reveals the saving activity of God (through judgment) in which He is vindicated
  - 1:18-3:20: God's charge that all humanity is under sin so that He is justified in His condemnation

#### God's Righteousness Manifested (pt. 4)

- Q: If we are the objects of God's just retribution in which He is justified, how can we also be the objects of His saving righteousness?
- A: Romans 3:21-26 "but now..."

### God's Righteousness Manifested (pt. 4)

- > God justifies the ungodly...
  - (1) through faith alone (instrument)
  - (2) by grace alone (manner)
  - (3) in Christ alone (ground/basis)

#### God's Righteousness Manifested (pt. 4)

- > God justifies the ungodly...
  - "...there can be no justification of the sinner which is not simultaneously a justification of God in his wrath against the sinner." (M. Seifrid; Christ, Our Righteousness)

# God's Righteousness Manifested (pt. 4)

- 1. The Purpose of Christ's Death
  - "to demonstrate God's righteousness" that God is vindicated in His contention against mankind
  - in justifying sinners God's contention with humanity is not set aside but brought to completion in His Son

# God's Righteousness Manifested (pt. 4)

- 2. The Need for this Demonstration
  - A. In the past (before the cross)
    - God delayed the full execution of His retributive justice for sins
    - Forgiveness under the Old Covenant has its ultimate basis in the death of Christ

## God's Righteousness Manifested (pt. 4)

- 2. The Need for this Demonstration
  - B. In the present ("now")
    - that God might be just *and* the justifier of the ungodly through faith in Jesus
    - faith in Jesus is acknowledging our guilt and just condemnation before God, and taking hold of Christ as our righteousness
