The Gospel of God

Now faith is the assurance of *things* hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. (Hebrews 11:1)

And without faith it is impossible to please *Him*, for he who comes to God must believe that He is and *that* He is a rewarder of those who seek Him. (Hebrews 11:6)

<sup>17</sup> As it is written, "A FATHER OF MANY NATIONS HAVE I MADE YOU" in the presence of God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into being that which does not exist.

<sup>18</sup> In hope against hope he believed, so that he might become a father of many nations according to that which had been spoken, "SO SHALL YOUR DESCENDANTS BE."

<sup>19</sup> Without becoming weak in faith he contemplated his own body, now as good as dead since he was about a hundred years old, and the deadness of Sarah's womb;

<sup>20</sup> yet, with respect to the promise of God, he did not waver in unbelief but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God,

<sup>21</sup> and being fully assured that what God had promised, He was able also to perform.

<sup>22</sup> Therefore IT WAS ALSO CREDITED TO HIM AS RIGHTEOUSNESS.

### Abraham's Faith

- 1. The God in whom he believed
  - the God who is able to do what is humanly impossible, yet vital to fulfilling the promise ("gives life to the dead")
  - the God who is able to call into being things which do not exist (i.e., Abraham's seed)

#### Abraham's Faith

- 2. The circumstances in which he believed
  - "against hope" he believed in the face of humanly/naturally impossible circumstances
  - "in hope" in spite of his circumstances, he believed because of the certainty of God's promise

#### Abraham's Faith

- 3. The constancy of his belief
  - he avoided a deep-seated and permanent attitude of distrust in the promise of God
  - his faith was strengthened in and by the promise of God

# Abraham's Faith

- 4. The basis of his belief
  - he was fully assured that God was able to do what He had promised
  - this faith only gives glory to God and is reckoned as righteousness

# Abraham's Faith

➤ The example of Abraham – encouragement, caution, and Christ
