"What shall we say then? Should we continue in sin that grace might increase?" (Romans 6:1)

### Romans Summary:

Justified by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone – apart from any works or merit

# Two Realms In Adam Reign of Sin and Death Condemnation Inherited Corruption Ours by Nature In Christ Reign of Life and Grace Justification Gift of Righteousness Ours by Grace

"And the Law came in that transgression might increase; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more." (Romans 5:20)

### 1. The Question

"What shall we say then? Should we continue in sin that grace might increase?" (Romans 6:1)

- > Possible Answers/Solutions:
  - a) Legalism addition of Law to keep people from abusing grace
  - b) License believers may continue in sin without any change or sanctification

### 2. Paul's Answer

"May it never be! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?" (Romans 6:2)

we can't! – it is ultimately not possible for the believer to live in sin

### 2. Paul's Answer

• "died to sin" – a decisive separation from the rule or realm of sin

(when and how? – in the death of Christ through baptism)

• "live in sin" – a habitual practice of sin; one's life is characterized by sin

## > Implications

- Living a life pleasing to God flows from the real experience of liberation from sin's domain ("we have died to sin")
- 2. Sin remains a real threat it is possible at times and in degrees to live in a way that is inconsistent with the reality that we have died to sin
