(Romans 6:12-14)


First Imperative of Romans:

"Even so consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus."

Practical Imperatives

> What Paul does NOT conclude...

- that sin itself is done away with for Christians
- that our struggle/battle with sin is over



Practical Imperatives

- 1. Negatively ("do not...")
 - do not let sin's reign occupy your lives, which results in obeying your sinful passions
 - do not offer your natural faculties as weapons in the service of sin

Practical Imperatives

- 2. Positively
 - in view of who you are in Christ ("alive from the dead"), offer yourselves to God
 - offer your natural faculties ("members") as weapons in service to God

Practical Imperatives

- 3. Reality (grounds)
 - sin shall never have lordship over you again
 - you are not under the sin-strengthening regime of the old realm (the Law), but under the freedom-from-sin power of the new realm (grace)

Practical Imperatives
