### The Great Romans 8

No Condemnation: The Assurance of the Christian

- > "Therefore now..." (8:1)
  - marks a significant conclusion to the entire preceding section on justification (especially 5:1ff – "hope")
  - Paul reasserts the Christian's assurance in a new form by including the subjects of chapters 6-7
- $^{\rm 1}{\rm Therefore}$  now there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.
- $^2$  For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death.
- <sup>3</sup> For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God *did*: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and *as an offering* for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh,
- <sup>4</sup> so that the requirement of the Law might be fulfilled in us, who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

(Romans 8:1-4)

### No Condemnation

- 1. The Reality: No Condemnation!
  - both the pronouncement and execution of God's judgment are removed from us
  - this is the present reality only for those who are "in Christ Jesus"

#### No Condemnation

- 2. The Reason
  - A. Liberation by the Spirit
    - the power of the Spirit who confers life has set us free from the power of sin that leads to death
    - this complete liberation from sin's rule is our present position "in Christ Jesus"

# No Condemnation

- 2. The Reason
  - B. Condemnation of sin in Christ
    - the law had no ability to deliver anyone from sin's power and thus give life
    - God executed his judgment on sin in the atoning death of his Son

# No Condemnation

- 3. The Result
  - > Fulfillment of the righteous ordinance of the law?
    - the life which the law offered is fulfilled in us in our resurrection

## No Condemnation

> Implication: God is for us, not against us!
