(Romans 8:18)

²⁶ In the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for *us* with groanings too deep for words; ²⁷ and He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to *the will of* God.

The Spirit's Intercession

- 1. Why does the Spirit pray for us?
 - because in our weakness of this age we do not always know what to pray for
 - because of our inability to discern God's will clearly in the many things for which we pray

The Spirit's Intercession

2. How does the Spirit pray for us?

- with an inaudible "language" in our hearts, in a manner imperceptible to us
- our prayers/groanings are translated by the Spirit into his own language of prayer

The Spirit's Intercession

- 3. What does the Spirit pray for us?
 - He prays for the saints in perfect accord with the sovereign will of God

The Spirit's Intercession

- > Implications:
 - 1. The Necessity of Prayer
 - God has ordained prayer as a necessary means of accomplishing His purpose
 - Prayer displays the glory of God by manifesting our dependence on His power and grace

The Spirit's Intercession

- > Implications:
 - 2. The Present Help for Believers
 - we are not expected to know the will of God in every circumstance we face
 - God the Father always responds to the prays of the Spirit we are secure forever!
