God's Eternal Purpose

- A. Five Divine Actions ("golden chain")
 - Observations:
 - · divine actions human activity is not in view
 - inseparable actions the exact same people are the objects of each divine action
 - completed actions these actions are wholly and certainly ours in Christ Jesus

God's Eternal Purpose

- A. Five Divine Actions ("golden chain")
 - "Foreknew" God knew (i.e., loved) us before the foundation of the world
 - · not merely that He knew of our faith beforehand
 - "knew" a distinguishing regard or love for; God "fore-loved" us or "chose" us

God's Eternal Purpose

- A. Five Divine Actions ("golden chain")
 - "Predestined" God determined the ultimate destiny of those He foreknew/chose
 - our ultimate destiny is conformity to the Son (our complete "adoption" – Eph. 1:5)

God's Eternal Purpose

- A. Five Divine Actions ("golden chain")
 - "Called" God's effectual summoning of us into a relationship with Him
 - through the gospel God calls us irresistibly to faith in Christ

God's Eternal Purpose

- A. Five Divine Actions ("golden chain")
 - 4. "Justified" God gave us His saving righteousness through Christ so that we are declared righteous

God's Eternal Purpose

- A. Five Divine Actions ("golden chain")
 - 5. "Glorified" God transforms us into the image of the resurrected Christ
 - the necessary, inevitable vindicating action of our justification

God's Eternal Purpose

- A. Five Divine Actions ("golden chain")
 - 1. Foreknew
 - 2. Predestined
 - 3. Called
 - 4. Justified
 - 5. Glorified

God's Eternal Purpose

- B. Eternal Purpose
 - that we, adopted sons, will be conformed to the image of the resurrected Son
 - that He, the Son, might become the "first-born" of many brothers, the sons of God
