My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. And by this we know that we have come to know him, if we keep his commandments. 1. A Command for Christians: Do not sin (v.1a)

- Acknowledgement of sin is not the ultimate goal.
- John's purpose is to encourage Christians not to sin.

2. Hope for sinners: Jesus (vv.1b-2)

• Jesus is an advocate, on our behalf, with the Father.

The only advocate we need is Jesus.

Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

2. Hope for sinners: Jesus (vv.1b-2)

- Jesus is an advocate, on our behalf, with the Father.
- Jesus is the propitiation for our sins

Jesus: Savior of the world

Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." (John 12:20–21)

Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. (John 12:24)

And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself. (John 12:32)

Jesus: Savior of the world
