#### Romans: The Gospel of God

<sup>1</sup>Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called *as* an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God,

 $^{2}\,\mbox{which}$  He promised beforehand through His prophets in the holy Scriptures,

 $^{\rm 3}$  concerning His Son, who was born of a descendant of David according to the flesh,

<sup>4</sup> who was designated the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead, according to the Spirit of holiness, Jesus Christ our Lord.

### Romans: The Gospel of God

> Thesis Statement:

<sup>16</sup> For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

 $^{17}\,\mathrm{For}$  in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "But the righteous man shall live by faith."

#### Romans: The Gospel of God

 $^{30}\,\text{For}$  just as you once were disobedient to God, but now have been shown mercy because of their disobedience,

<sup>31</sup> so these also now have been disobedient, that because of the mercy shown to you they also may now be shown mercy

mercy.  $$^{32}\!$  For God has shut up all in disobedience so that He may show mercy to all.
