Unconditional Election

God chose out of fallen humanity those He would save; He choice was not conditioned on anything in the person, either foreseen faith, actions, desires or dispositions

Is this fair or just?!

¹⁴ What shall we say then? There is no injustice with God, is there? May it never be!

 $^{15}\,\mbox{For He}$ says to Moses, "I WILL HAVE MERCY ON WHO I HAVE MERCY, AND I WILL HAVE COMPASSION ON WHOM I HAVE COMPASSION."

¹⁶ So then it *does* not *depend* on the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy.

 $^{17}\,\text{For}$ the Scripture says to Pharaoh, "For this Very Purpose I raised you up, to demonstrate My Power in You, and that My Name might be proclaimed throughout the Whole Earth."

¹⁸ So then He has mercy on whom He desires, and He hardens whom He desires.

Is God Unjust?

- 1. The Objection
 - God is unjust to base His election to salvation upon nothing a person does
 - This objection can only be raised (unsuccessfully) against the doctrine of "unconditional" election

Is God Unjust?

2. Paul's Answer

¹⁸Then Moses said, "I pray You, show me Your glory!" ¹⁹And He said, "I Myself will make all My goodness pass before you, and will proclaim the name of the LORD before you; and *I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will show compassion on whom I will show compassion."*

(Exodus 33:18-19)

Is God Unjust?

2. Paul's Answer

- the essence of God's character is the freedom to show mercy to whom He chooses
- God's mercy is not a matter of justice to those who receive it, but altogether undeserved

Is God Unjust?

Election keeps no one out of heaven who would otherwise have been there, but it keeps a whole multitude of sinners out of hell who otherwise would have been there.

There is hope for the worst of sinners!
