The Book of Romans

The Gospel of God

"Gospel" (god-spel) – good news announced by a messenger who is sent or commissioned

"Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called as an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, ² which He promised beforehand through His prophets in the holy Scriptures, ³ concerning His Son...Jesus Christ our Lord, ⁵ through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about *the* obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for His name's sake" (Romans 1:1-5)

⁸ But what does it say? "THE WORD IS NEAR YOU, IN YOUR MOUTH AND IN YOUR HEART"—that is, the word of faith which we are preaching, ⁹ that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; ¹⁰ for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, "EVERYONE WHO BELIEVES IN HIM WILL NOT BE DISAPPOINTED." ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same *Lord* is Lord of all, abounding in riches for all who call on Him; ¹³ for "EVERYONE WHO CALLS ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED."

(Romans 10:8-13)

¹⁴ How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher?

¹⁵ How will they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, "How BEAUTIFUL ARE THE FEET OF THOSE WHO PREACH THE GOSPEL OF GOOD THINGS!"

¹⁶ However, they did not all heed the good news; for Isaiah says, "LORD, WHO HAS BELIEVED OUR REPORT?"

Universal Proclamation

- 1. The Necessity of Gospel Proclamation
 - Paul gives the necessary conditions for salvation: calling-believing-hearing-proclaiming-sending
 - Paul's emphasis is on the necessity of gospel proclamation through those sent by God (Isaiah 52:7)

Isaiah 52:7: "How beautiful are the feet of those who proclaim the gospel"

- 1. The precious value of gospel-messengers
- 2. The implicit sending by God of Paul and the apostles to proclaim this gospel

Universal Proclamation

- 2. The Certainty of Gospel Proclamation
 - God has sent messengers of this good news the foundational conditions of this universal faith have been fulfilled
 - This gospel proclamation is met with resistance by Israel and faith by the nations
