Romans 12:17-21

¹⁷ Never pay back evil for evil to anyone. Take thought of that which is good in the sight of all men. ¹⁸ If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men.

 19 Never take your own revenge, beloved, but leave room for the wrath *of God*, for it is written, "VENGEANCE IS MINE, I WILL REPAY," says the Lord. 20 "BUT IF YOUR ENEMY IS HUNGRY, FEED HIM, AND IF HE IS THIRSTY, GIVE HIM A DRINK; FOR IN SO DOING YOU WILL HEAP BURNING COALS ON HIS HEAD." 21 Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Love Your Enemy

- > Commands
 - 1. Leave vengeance to God
 - · do not justify revenge as something "deserved"
 - believing in the reality God's ultimate vengeance, frees us to love our enemy sincerely
 - vengeance belongs uniquely to the Lord; He will execute His judgment perfectly

⁴ Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?

⁵ But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart you are storing up wrath for yourself in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God,

- > Commands
 - 2. Do good to your enemy
 - we are to perform practical acts of helpfulness for our enemy in the ordinary things of life

²⁷ "But I say to you who hear, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸ bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. ²⁹ Whoever hits you on the cheek, offer him the other also; and whoever takes away your coat, do not withhold your shirt from him either. ³⁰ Give to everyone who asks of you, and whoever takes away what is yours, do not demand it back. ³¹ Treat others the same way you want them to treat you...

³⁵ But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High; for He Himself is kind to ungrateful and evil *men*. ³⁶ Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

(Luke 6:27-36)

Love Your Enemy

- > Commands
 - 2. Do good to your enemy
 - we are to perform practical acts of helpfulness for our enemy in the ordinary things of life
 - doing good to our enemy is a means of causing his shame which may lead to repentance

Love Your Enemy

- Summary
 - Do not allow the evil of our enemy to produce in us attitudes and actions of hatred and revenge
 - 2. Constantly seek to do good as an instrument that vanquishes the animosity of our enemy

Love Your Enemy

- > Resource
 - God loved us while we were enemies, and overcame evil with good—death of Christ (cf. Rom. 5:10)
