➤ Paul interrupted these greetings with an exhortation to watch out for false teachers and to turn away from them (16:17-20)

A Final Encouragement

"And the God of peace will soon crush Satan under your feet. The grace of our Lord Jesus be with you." (Romans 16:20)

A Final Encouragement

- 1. The Original Promise
 - the seed of the woman would crush the head of the serpent (Gen. 3:15)

A Final Encouragement

- 2. The Decisive Defeat
 - the death and resurrection of Jesus rendered Satan powerless to condemn those in Christ
 - Cf. Col. 2:14-15; Heb. 2:14-15; Rev. 12:9-11

A Final Encouragement

- 3. The Final Victory
 - at the end of the age and return of Christ, Satan will be casted into "the lake of fire" (cf. Rev. 20:14)
 - the church crushes Satan through the exalted Christ, and reigns with Him (cf. Eph. 1:22-23; Rom. 8:17)
 - it is "soon" it is the climax of the age that has already dawned in the resurrection of Christ (cf. Rom. 13:12)
