Psalm 46: Psalm of Trust

- 2. God is our defense, though the nations rage (v.4-6)
 - · God's presence is the source of life and protection
 - ultimately a reference to the final or New Jerusalem (Rev. 21:1-3; 22:1)
 - · ultimately a reference to the final battle

GOD is our refuge and strength,

A very present help in trouble.

- ²Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change And though the mountains slip into the heart of the sea;
- ³ Though its waters roar and foam,

Though the mountains quake at its swelling pride. (Selah)

- ⁴ There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, The holy dwelling places of the Most High.
- ⁵ God is in the midst of her, she will not be moved;
 - God will help her when morning dawns.
- ⁶The nations made an uproar, the kingdoms tottered; He raised His voice, the earth melted.
- ⁷ The LORD of hosts is with us;

The God of Jacob is our stronghold. (Selah)

Psalm 46: Psalm of Trust

- 1. God is our defense, though the earth changes (v.1-3)
 - · central image: God is our "impenetrable defense"
 - · central point: He is with us to deliver and defend
 - · central expression of trust: we will not fear!

Psalm 46: Psalm of Trust

- 3. God is our defense, though the Lord brings His judgment (v.8-11)
 - a picture of final judgment and final deliverance
 - · central expression of trust restated: "Be still"

Psalm 46: Psalm of Trust

- > Application in the face of COVID-19
 - 1. Respond out of faith not fear
 - the antidote to fear is trust in the character, presence and promises of God in Christ (Matt. 6:25-34)
 - allow this time of uncertainty to expose misplaced trust, and to increase dependence on God (2 Cor. 1:9)
 - cast all your anxieties on Him because He cares for you (1 Pet. 5:7; Ps. 56:3-4)

Psalm 46: Psalm of Trust

- > Application in the face of COVID-19
 - 2. Respond out of love not fear
 - the reason we change our practices is not mainly selfprotection but love for neighbor
 - our trust in God and love for neighbor compel us at times to risk our own safety, health and life
