Romans 9-11

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- Israel's unbelief and the promise of God
- 1. The Word of Promise and Judgment (9:1-29)
 - Paul emphasizes the freedom of God in His mercy and hardening in creating children of God
 - presently, God is showing mercy to Gentiles but Israel has been reduced to a remnant through God's judgment/hardening

³⁰ What shall we say then? That Gentiles, who did not pursue righteousness, attained righteousness, even the righteousness which is by faith; ³¹ but Israel, pursuing a law of righteousness, did not arrive at *that* law. ³² Why? Because *they did* not *pursue it* by faith, but as though *it were* by works. They stumbled over the stumbling stone, ³³ just as it is written,

"BEHOLD, I LAY IN ZION A STONE OF STUMBLING AND A ROCK OF OFFENSE,

And he who believes in Him will not be disappointed."

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¹ Brethren, my heart's desire and my prayer to God for them is for *their* salvation. ² For I testify about them that they have a zeal for God, but not in accordance with knowledge. ³ For not knowing about God's righteousness and seeking to establish their own, they did not subject themselves to the righteousness of God. ⁴ For Christ is the end of the law so that there might be righteousness to everyone who believes.

Explaining Israel's Failure

- 1. Israel's response to the "word of faith"
 - they stumbled over Christ because they did not heed the Law
 - they did not submit to God's righteousness in Christ because they sought to establish their own by the law

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Explaining Israel's Failure

2. The nature of the "word of faith"

⁵ For Moses writes about the righteousness which is based on law: the man who does these things shall live by them. ⁶ But the righteousness based on faith speaks as thus: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?' (that is, to bring Christ down), ⁷ or 'Who will dead)." ⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart"—that is, the word of faith which we are preaching, ⁹ that if you confess with your mouth Jesus *as* Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved;

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¹⁰ for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, "WHOEVER BELIEVES IN HIM WILL NOT BE DISAPPOINTED." ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same *Lord* is Lord of all, abounding in riches for all who call on Him; ¹³ for "WHOEVER WILL CALL ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED."

Explaining Israel's Failure

- 2. The nature of the "word of faith"
 - it is a message that simply demands faith for righteousness, not works or human effort
 - it's content is the work of God in the crucified and risen Christ
 - it is universally accessible to every human being, Jew or Gentile

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Explaining Israel's Failure

3. The proclamation of the "word of faith"

¹⁴ How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher? ¹⁵ How will they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, "How BEAUTIFUL ARE THE FEET OF THOSE WHO PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL OF GOOD THINGS!"

¹⁶ However, they did not all heed the gospel; for Isaiah says, "LORD, WHO HAS BELIEVED OUR REPORT?" ¹⁷ So faith *comes* from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ.

¹⁸ But I say, surely they have never heard, have they? Indeed they have;

"THEIR VOICE HAS GONE OUT INTO ALL THE EARTH, AND THEIR WORDS TO THE ENDS OF THE WORLD."

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 $^{\rm 19}\,{\rm But}$ I say, surely Israel did not know, did they? At the first Moses says,

"I WILL MAKE YOU JEALOUS BY THAT WHICH IS NOT A NATION, BY A NATION WITHOUT UNDERSTANDING WILL I ANGER YOU."

²⁰ And Isaiah is very bold and says,

"I was found by those who did not seek Me,

I BECAME MANIFEST TO THOSE WHO DID NOT ASK FOR ME."

²¹ But as for Israel He says,

"ALL THE DAY LONG I HAVE STRETCHED OUT MY HANDS TO A DISOBEDIENT AND OBSTINATE PEOPLE."

Explaining Israel's Failure

- 3. The proclamation of the "word of faith"
 - God has sent messengers of this good news; the essential conditions for faith are fulfilled
 - in fulfillment of Scripture, this proclamation is met by the unbelief of Israel and by faith among the Gentiles

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Implication:

> The *necessity* and *certainty* of gospel proclamation for salvation

So faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ. (Rom. 10:17)

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
