John 20:1-31

- 1. John and the Empty Tomb
 - Q: What is the significance of the empty tomb?
 - it requires an explanation (how?)
 - Jesus was raised bodily (not "spiritually")

John 20:1-31

- 2. Mary and the Mistaken Identity
 - Mary had no thought of the resurrection she was seeking the dead body of Jesus
 - · Jesus was raised bodily, yet transformed
 - Jesus' relationship to His followers will now be different, yet better

- 3. Thomas and the Blessing of Belief
 - Thomas represents how unlikely the idea of resurrection was to the disciples
 - Thomas represents the only appropriate response to the risen Jesus – the confession "my Lord and my God"
